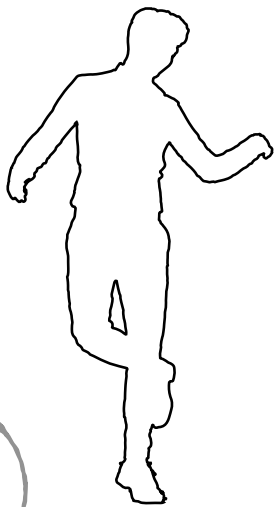


Dannsa // Dancing

Can you name these different Scottish dance styles?

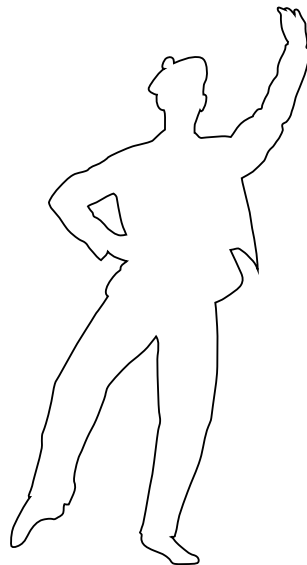

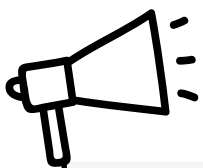

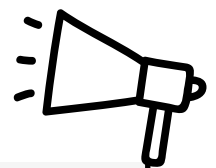
