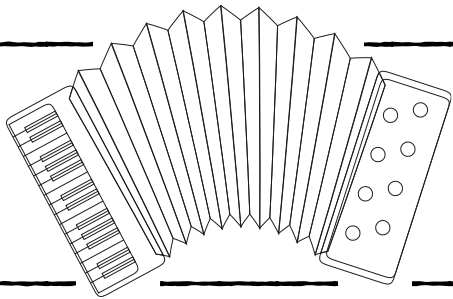


# Gàidhlig // Gaelic
